

Our specialist Bereavement Team help families to cope with the death of their loved one and adapt to their new life without them. They provide one to one support, group support, and advice. They host events such as the Remembering Day Service and the Christmas Candlelight Service, giving families opportunities to connect with others who understand what they've been through.

We're there for families every step of the way. With a gift in your Will, you can ensure we help families navigate the future.

Why your Will is important to YOU

Your Will is your lasting legacy. By leaving gifts to the people and causes you love, your love and kindness continues beyond your lifetime. Celebrate the things that matter to you, with the gifts in your Will.

It's important for all adults to have an up to date Will. It reflects your wishes, makes things easier for those left behind, and could also reduce inheritance tax.

You should write or update your Will when:

- You marry
- You have children and/or grandchildren
- Pivou separate or divorce
- You retire
- Your finances significantly change.

You should check your Will still reflects your wishes every five years.

Three simple steps to writing your Will

Step One: Value your estate

This doesn't have to be exact, but it's helpful for a solicitor to know the value of your estate. Think about your house, savings, and any high value items.

Step Two: Executors and beneficiaries

The executors are the people responsible for ensuring your Will is carried out. It should be someone you trust, who's capable. Your beneficiaries are the people who will receive from your estate. Loved ones, friends, and causes you care about. You should consider carefully who will be your executor, and your beneficiaries.

Step Three: Consider your wishes

You can leave specific items, pecuniary gifts (set amounts like £3,000) or residual gifts (a percentage of your estate). Consider what you might want to leave to who.

You don't need to have all the answers, but when you have a good idea of what you want it's time to contact a solicitor. They can guide you through the process and capture your wishes.

Free Will Writing Service

As a CHAS supporter, you can access our Free Will Writing Service, which will connect you with a law society registered solicitor in your area. There's no obligation to leave a gift to CHAS, but we're so grateful to everyone who considers it.

To fund our services


Thanks to people like you, gifts in Wills funds the cost of care to 1 in every 6 families we support. 25% of donations are from gifts in Wills.
